By 2002, a stronger statewide Florida building code had been adapted and put in place.

GET WITH THE PROGRAM

Florida will always have hurricanes. The Florida Legislature created the **MY SAFE FLORIDA HOME Program** to help homeowners strengthen their homes against wind damage.

Money-Saving Grants for Home Upgrades (up to \$10,000). Homeowners who have already received their free home wind mitigation inspection are eligible to apply for grant money to spend on home strengthening improvements. That's thousands of dollars families can put towards making the necessary renovations they need to keep their families safe—and qualify for lower insurance premiums.
